# **Art at Alexandra Primary School: Printing**

## Year 2

-To block print using regular and irregular patterns and to create a monoprint using wax crayons.

-To be confident in their understanding that the same objects and materials can be used for varying effects.

-To identify and talk about pattern and texture in natural and man-made objects. To begin to collect visual information from a range of sources.

## <u>Year 1</u>

-To explore printing simple pictures with a range of hard and soft materials such as cork and sponge.

-To use equipment and media correctly and to be able to produce a clean, printed image.

-To experiment and understand that the more pressure applied when printing, the clearer the print will be.

-To begin to identify forms of printing: books, posters, pictures and fabrics and talk about how they were made.

-To begin to use relevant vocabulary to discuss how their artwork was made.

## Early Years

GUIS

-To use materials such as leaves, coins and bricks to experiment with rubbings.

-To create simple pictures and patterns by printing with a variety of objects such as bubbles, fruit.

-To talk about how the artwork was created and what they like about it.

## Year 3

-To observe that a block print is a mirror image of the block used to create it. To make an incised block print by engraving into polystyrene.

-To explore different techniques for block printing such as overlaying prints to create different colours,

texturing the surface of the block

or cutting away parts of the block.

-To use sketchbooks to collect visual information from different sources and to record experimentations -To use an increasingly wide vocabulary to describe how artwork was made and reflect on own work.

## Perform

## Year 4

-To explore relief printing and to create textured collagraphs using a range of materials.

-To produce detailed prints with these collagraphs with increasing expertise and skill.

-To produce repeated patterns with variation of colour through overprinting with up to 3 different colours.

-To use sketchbooks to collect visual information from different sources and to record experimentations and ideas for future pieces of artwork.

--To use an increasingly wide vocabulary to describe how artwork was made and reflect on own work.

## <u>Year 5</u>

-To explore mono-printing (both negative and positive).

-To experiment with tools used and to print onto a variety of materials including fabric.

To continue to gain experience in overlaying colours.

-To use print as a starting point in a piece of mixed media artwork.

-To use these tools with increasing expertise and skill and to do this in a mature and safe way.

-To use sketchbooks to research and collect visual information from different sources and a range of artists. -To reflect on their artwork and to use relevant vocabulary to describe the techniques, processes and overall effectiveness of their work.

### Year 6

-To carve and cut into linoleum to create a detailed block print.

-To work with an artist to produce a piece of artwork using screen-printing. -To experiment with both positive and negative printing in order to make informed artistic decisions.

-To use tools with increasing expertise and skill and to do so in a mature and safe way. -To use sketchbooks to research and collect visual information from different sources and a range of artists. To develop their own style that is informed by a range of artists. -To reflect on artwork and to use relevant vocabulary to describe the techniques, processes and overall effectiveness of their work. To consider how work could be adapted and developed further.
