

School Council

- School council led classes involvement in some virtual climate change workshops that were being run in Hounslow during COP26. Feedback provided said that they found them informative and helped them to understand some of the things they could do to help reduce climate change.
- School council have been involved in promoting the Child Friendly Safeguarding Policy with their classes and have contributed to an Anti-bullying leaflet that will be shared with children to offer them guidance around the theme of bullying. In addition, they have surveyed their classes to discuss areas of the playground that they consider to be hotspots for poor behaviour choices. They have suggested that most bullying type behaviours tend to happen at lunchtime and so some additional Anti-Bullying training for SMSAs has been arranged so that this can be dealt with effectively and immediately.
- Children asked their classes for some feedback on the School Breathe sessions. Almost all classes were able to give examples of some of the techniques that they had found helpful to them and that they enjoyed using. They have been asked now to try to encourage others to use these strategies if they see them getting angry or upset.
- On the 18th March, some volunteers from school council will meet with Wilson Jones to provide some feedback from their classes on the current school meals provision and find out about the Summer Term menu.
- Following a Smart School Council survey of all the KS1 and 2 classes, the children have voted for some activities they would like to do to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee in June.
- Suggestions for fundraising ideas for Comic Relief have been discussed and selected by school council. A letter to parents will be sent this week.
- We are currently in the process of organizing a School Council Conference with the other C8 schools around the theme of climate change. We have organised a guest speaker from Hounslow's sustainability team to speak to the children.
