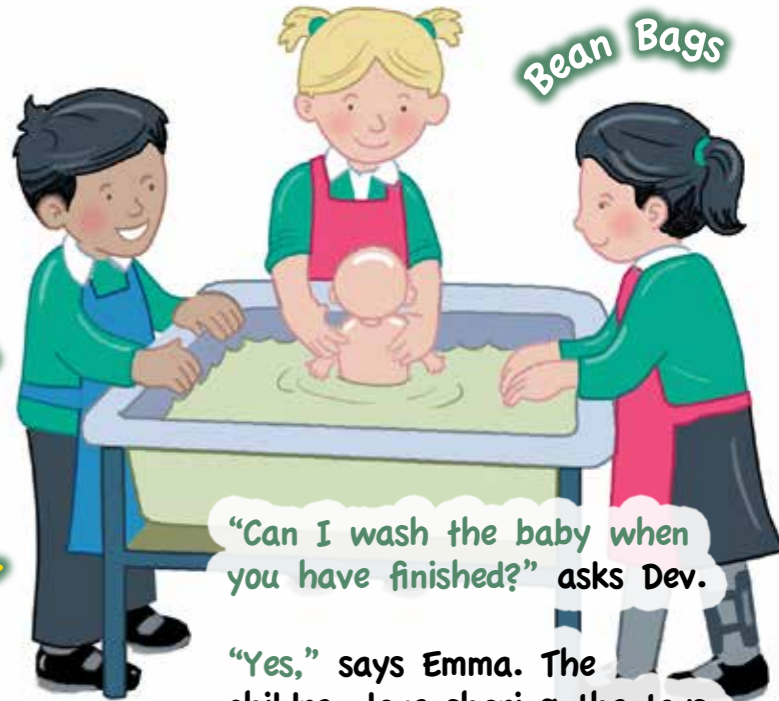

What happens when I need the toilet?



You can go to the toilet whenever you need to. If you are doing an activity with your teacher, just tell the teacher that you need to go as this is polite.

“I need to use the toilet,” he says.

“Let me know if you need any help,” the teacher says.

Dev knows that if he ever needs help or has an accident, he can just say “help me, please” and his teacher will be there straight away to help.




Dev goes to the toilet. He loves the beautiful doors, and he is very pleased that everything is just the right size for him.

When he has been to the toilet, he washes his hands with soap and warm water to make sure they are very clean. This is very important because this helps stop germs spreading.



“I am glad that I practised going to the toilet all by myself before I came to nursery,” he says. “I don’t need any help!”


What happens at the end of my nursery session?

Your grown-ups will be waiting outside for you. Your teacher will go to the door and when they see your grown-ups, they will call your name and you can go.

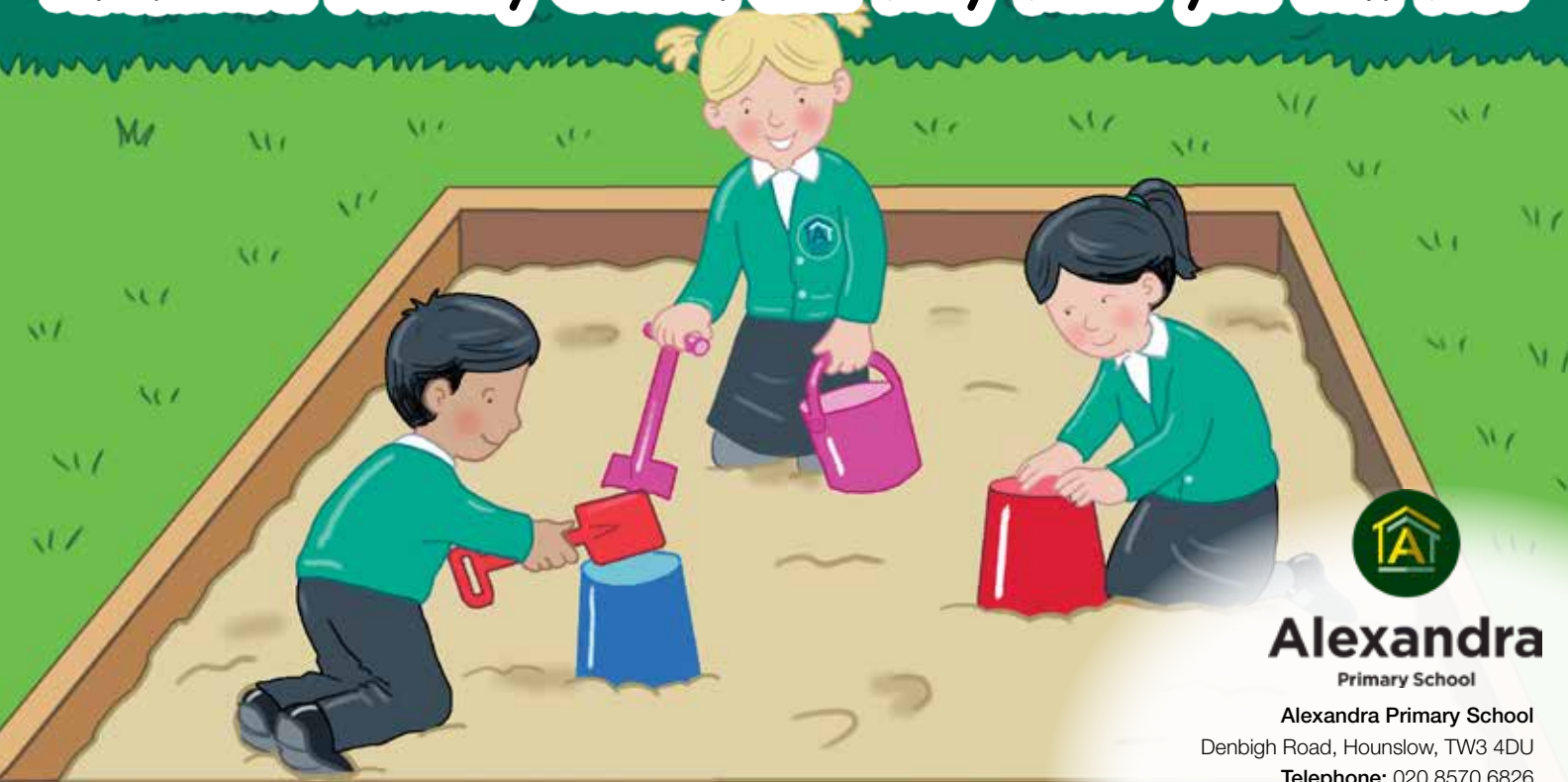
“Emma, your mum is here,” says the teacher.
