

# Alexandra Primary School



Tackling congestion at the school gates and improving the environment for walking and cycling to school.

Hounslow Council is proposing to introduce 'School Street' measures on **Denbigh Road** and part of **Tiverton Road** to reduce motor traffic at drop off and pick up time around Alexandra Primary School.

The restrictions aim to promote active and healthy lifestyles by:

- Improving road safety for pupils, residents and visitors to the area
- Increasing levels of walking, cycling and scooting
- Minimising anti-social behaviour arising from inconsiderate parking and dangerous manoeuvres
- Reducing engine idling and pollution in the area, including particulates, which especially impact young people
- Creating a calmer environment for pupils to start and end their school day

# How will it work?

- Denbigh Road and part of Tiverton Road (as marked below) would be a pedestrian and cycle only zone from **8:15 – 9:15am** and **2:45 – 3:45pm** on school days.
- Access would be permitted for local residents and school staff subject to vehicle registration.
- Vehicles driven by parents/guardians would not be permitted to enter the zone during the timed closure.
- The School Street would be enforced by camera which means unauthorised vehicles entering the zone would be issued a penalty charge notice.



*Proposed School Street Zone*

- Blue badge holders would be entitled to an exemption and can register their vehicle to gain access.

## Other Examples

- At **Cranford Primary School**, their School Street was well received by local residents and the school community with pupil travel data showing a reduction in car use from **30% to 13%**, and an increase in walking and cycling from **63% to 82%** between 2017 and 2019.
