<p>Together can you act out the story We're Going on a Bear Hunt. You can create actions for squelching through the mud and splashing through the water.</p>	<p>This week we will be focusing on 2D shapes and organising objects by categories. You could use the autumn objects that you have collected to sort into piles. Alternatively, you could cut out some shapes and hide them around your home. Can your child find the shapes and sort them into piles?</p>	<p>Autumn – When out for a walk look at the trees and notice the different colours as the leaves changing. You could collect some autumn objects – leaves, conkers, pine cones and make a picture together.</p>
