











Early Years Weekly Overview

Let's find out how many we have altogether.</p>	<p>Can you act out the story of a squash and a squeeze with toys. Using a box as the house how many animals can you fit inside? How many do you need to take out so that it isn't a squash?</p>

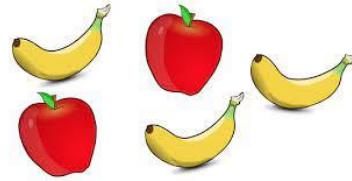
