#### Year 2

### Year 1

To talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another.

To know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things.

To identify the main physical and human characteristics of the countries of Europe.

To describe geographical similarities and differences between a region in the United Kingdom and one in a European country (Greece).

To describe how the locality of the school has changed over time.

#### Year 4

To compare geographical regions (Europe) and their identifying human and physical characteristics, including hills, mountains, cities, rivers, key topographical features and land-use patterns, and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time

To describe geographical similarities and differences between countries (the UK and Italy).

## Year 6

To describe geographical diversity across the world. Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of physical geography of a region of the United Kingdom and India.
