<p>Talk about times when you are proud of something you have done. When praise is due to your child, when they have done something that is proud worthy, tell them that you are proud of them and explain why you are proud of them, for example when they engage well with their home learning, when they show caring emotions towards others. Link with the story "Wombat Stew" from Google classroom learning.</p>	<p>Encourage your child to talk about their games that they are playing, for example, explain pictures they are drawing, talk about models they are making using construction toys. Encourage your child to talk using sentences and give clarity to their descriptions.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>This week's key vocabulary</b></p> <p>Australia, Australian animals including -wombat, kangaroo, joey, koala, aborigine, boomerang.</p>	<p>Take opportunities to exercise, encourage fluent movements such as running, hopping and skipping.</p>

<p>Using the tricky words in the phonics packs encourage your child to practise spelling the words. Hear your child read their reading books. Make a comment in the Reading Log to let the class teacher know how they responded to the reading. Remember to read books on Bug Club...your log in is attached to your reading log.</p>	<p>Our maths focus this week is 1 more and 1 less. Make opportunities during the day to practise.</p> <p>Following last week's learning of quick response to showing fingers to 5, extend by asking your child to show up to 5 fingers then ask them to show 1 more/less and give the answer. Once your child can do this through visualising using their fingers, then extend their learning by asking for quick response to 1 more/less without the support of fingers.</p>	<p>This week we are learning about Australia. Engage in the learning opportunities on google classroom. Take the lead from your child's interest and search on the internet for more information. Ensure you work with your child on the internet to stay safe.</p>

<p>Using the phoneme cards sent home in the plastic wallet, practise recalling the sounds (not the letter names) of each of the letters. Learn to instantly recall the tricky words.</p>
