This half term our topic is: 'I am Unique'

| Personal, Social and Emotional development | Communication and Language | Physical Development |
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| <p>We have been learning about emotions - think about doing activities that make you feel happy. It could be dancing to music, running at the park, listening to a story, playing games together, cooking together or something else. Draw a picture of something you have done which has made you feel happy.</p> | <p>Encourage your child to listen and enjoy stories. Read their school library book to them. Share and talk about their favourite part of the story.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Key vocabulary to revisit and remember</p> <p>Parts of the body – head, elbow, knee, shoulder, hips, ankle. Senses - sight, eyes, hear, ears, taste, tongue, touch, skin, smell, nose. Feelings – happy, sad, angry, scared, calm, loved Autumn - season, leaves, hibernate, pinecones, conkers, acorns, hedgehog, squirrel</p> | <p>Provide children with opportunities to move freely and refine their moving skills. Go to the park and encourage them to run, skip and climb safely and to enjoy physical exercise.</p> <p>Encourage your child to strengthen their fingers ready for writing - knead, squeeze, roll playdough, pastry or bread dough.</p> |
| Literacy | Maths | Topic |
| <p>Using the phoneme cards in the plastic wallet, bring sounds together to make words i.e. h-a-t (hat) h-i-p (hip) c-o-d (cod). Encourage your child to say the phonemes and blend to read the words.</p> <p>Hear your child read their reading books. Make a comment in the Reading Log to let the class teacher know how they responded to the reading.</p> | <p>Enjoy playing with numbers. Play board games, such as snakes and ladders, encouraging your child to count forward and backwards as they move their counters. Go on number hunts when you are out and about.</p> | <p>This half term we have been learning about ourselves in our topic 'I am Unique'. Look at photos of your child together and talk about the differences between now and then. Ask your child to draw a picture of themselves as a baby.</p> |
| Phonics | | <p>We have also learnt about Autumn. Find some different shaped and coloured leaves. Describe them together. Create an Autumn collage.</p> |
| <p>Using the phoneme cards sent home in the plastic wallet, practise recalling the sounds (not the letter names) of each of the letters. Learn to instantly recall the tricky words.</p> | | |
