Mathematics

We will provide opportunities for our children to

- Find and match objects that are the same and • find objects that are different. We will promote children's ability to talk about difference.
- Understand that collections of objects can be ٠ sorted into sets based on different criteria such as colour, size or shape. Children will be encouraged to think of their own criteria.
- Compare sets of objects and understand that • sets of items can have more items, fewer items or the same amount of items than another set.
- To learn that objects can be compared according to their size using language such as big and little, large and small. More specific language such as tall and short will also be introduced. Children will be encouraged to compare and order objects by size and to explain what they notice.
- Compare the mass of objects.
- Copy, continue and create their own pattern.

Encourage your child to look and describe patterns in the environment.

Provide opportunities for your child to talk about things that are big and small and to understand that some objects are described as tall and short.

- Join in with dancing and ring games.

The children will learn to

- Hear and say the initial sounds in words.
- Read individual graphemes by saying the sounds for them.
- Blend sounds into words they can read.
- Recognise a few common exception words (tricky words).
- To write some lower case letters correctly.
- To write some words based on their phonic recognition.

Please encourage your child to recall the phonemes and tricky words sent home and please listen to your child read to you.

Communication and Language

We will be encouraging our children to

- Understand how to listen and why listening is important.
- Learn new vocabulary based on the different areas of learning.
- Articulate their ideas and thoughts.
- Develop social phrases such as 'good morning' and 'how are you'.
 - Engage in story time by hearing at least 1 story book daily.
- Talk about stories.

• Listen carefully to rhymes and songs and recognise rhyming words.
