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Our Autumn Term topic in Year 4 is 'Frozen Kingdoms.' We will be exploring frozen lands - both real and fictional - and the people and creatures who live in them. In preparation for this, we would like you to find out all about the life of an **Inuit child**. (Inuit is the name given to the native Americans who lived and live in the frozen north of the American continent.)

If you want to do your own search, you can use www.kiddle.co - a child-friendly search engine from Google. You may like to compare how Inuit children lived in the past and how they live now - or just focus on one or the other. Questions you might like to answer include:

Where did/do Inuit children live? Who with? What did/do they wear? What did/do they eat? How did/do they spend their days? What chores did/do they do? How did/do they play? How were/are they educated? As well as writing about the Inuit children, we hope that you will make some art as well. Perhaps you could draw or paint pictures of Inuit children. Or, you might prefer to make a model or sculpture. We look forward to seeing your creations and reading about all you have found out!
