


<p>Bug Club - Read the book Bug Boy: Beetle Cookies, linked to our mini beast topic.</p> <p>Before reading the book, read the title. Do you think there will really be a beetle in the cookies? Help your child to blend the sounds in words like <i>book</i> and <i>room</i>. Also help them with the words <i>saw</i>, <i>looked</i>, <i>beetle</i> and <i>cookies</i>.</p> <p>Carry on reading other books on Bug Club. We can check how many books you have read so we can add more if you need. Do make sure you have clicked on every bug and answered all the questions fully. Otherwise the computer thinks you have not finished and we are not able to give you a new book. Please do not read 5 or 6 books a day as there is a limited supply of books available.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch the Letters and Sounds video each day according to the group information sent:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCP_FbjYUP_UtldV2K_niWw/featured?disable_polymer=1</p>	<p>For writing, this week, we would like you to write a list:</p> <p>If you go to the park or whilst in your garden, find some minibeasts and write a list of the ones you see. Remember a list is not a sentence, it has words – one word underneath another.</p> <p>You could start like this:</p> <p>In the park, I found:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an ant • a bee • a worm <p>Challenge: Help your Mum or Dad to write a shopping list with the things she/he needs;</p> 	<p>Doodle maths Go to doodlemaths.com. Log into your doodle account using your Bug Club password. Complete activities for 10 minutes. Make sure you work out the answers yourself!</p> <p><u>Learning to count in 5s</u></p> <p>Sort toys/raisins into groups of 5.
