Can you make a list of the 2D shapes eg triangles, squares, circles, rectangles and 3D shapes eg cube, cuboid, cylinder that you can see?</p>	<p>Make music with different items in your home – what sounds do you hear? Is there a way to change the sound something makes? How can you make it quieter or louder? Make a rocket picture or a rocket using recycled boxes. Label the rocket with numbers going backwards.</p> <p>Make an Easter card for your family.</p>
