<p>Involve your child to talk about what activity they have enjoyed this week. Encourage them to talk share their opinions.</p> <p>Demonstrate solving minor conflicts using discussion – for example, when sharing a toy with a sibling or arranging activities. Encourage children to talk about their ideas and listen to other people to solve a small problem.</p>	<p>Look at some family photos together. Talk about what is happening. Encourage your child to look at photos of themselves and talk about what they were doing, encourage them to recall events.</p> <p>Play with small world toys ie cars, figurines, dolls, teddies etc enable your child to use their imagination to create stories</p> <p>When sharing stories together, talk about the story and the characters. Ask your child to explain events in stories. Try asking why they think events happened or why characters acted the way they did.</p>	<p>Practise writing the graphemes j,g, y, p, q. Use the letter sheet in the learning pack to model.</p> <p>Have some fun with daily exercising with Joe Wicks on You tube at 9am each morning.</p> <p>Join in moving and dancing with Debbie Doo https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aQ2Vco_giiE</p> <p>Talk about keeping healthy, such as making healthy food choices, doing exercise and sleeping well.</p>	<p>This term we will be learning about life cycles and we want to start with an investigation task for you!</p> <p>We want you to think of animals that come from eggs! 
