


# Weekly Creative Home Learning

<p>Involve your child to talk about what activity they have enjoyed this week. Explore the new vocabulary in the story such as</p>  <p>Talk about any words your child doesn't know and search for the meaning together on internet.</p>	<p>Practise writing the graphemes for the digraphs ch, sh, th, Use the letter sheet in the learning pack to model.</p> <p>Have some fun with daily exercising with Joe Wicks on You tube at 9am each morning.</p> <p>Choose one of the moving and dancing activities with Debbie Doo <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aQ2Vco_giiE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aQ2Vco_giiE</a></p> <p>Practise getting dressed each morning independently – preparing for getting changed for PE when back at school.</p>	<p>This week we are learning about the life cycle of the hen and we want to start with an investigation task for you!</p> <p>We want you to think of the hen and its babies. Ask your mum and dad to help you .You can use internet or books. Remember you can use the story of the week (Dora's eggs) to find some facts.</p> <p><b>Life Cycle of a Chicken</b></p>  <p>You could label the diagram above and then write a sentence or few sentences about this life cycle.</p>

<p><b>Bug Club</b> - Read a new book on bug club! We can check how many books you have read so we can add more if you need. Do make sure you have clicked on <b>every bug</b> and answered all the questions fully. Otherwise the computer thinks you have not finished and we are not able to give you a new book. Please do not read 5 or 6 books a day as there is a limited supply of books available.</p> <p><b>Phonics</b></p> <p>From Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April watch the Letters and Sounds video each day, as per text message that you have received from APS showing the most appropriate lesson for your child to watch. There is also a letter on the school website giving some understanding of the videos and a link to access them. Clicking on the link before Monday, you can see some information about what the videos aim to do.</p>	<p>Following the telling the story Dora's Eggs (see above) - draw a story map telling the story. Log into your doodle account using your Bug Club password. Complete activities for 10 minutes. Make sure you work out the answers yourself!</p> <p>This week we are going to learn how to count in two's.          Think about what comes in two's, eg legs, eyes, ears, socks...and how counting in two's can make our life easier.          Explain the children that to count in two's you have to skip one number.
